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Biographical Sketches

John Enright (1852-1926)

John Enright (1852-1926), was born the son of John and Margaret Enright in Colts Neck, NJ. After finishing his elementary education (during winter leaves from his family's farm), he graduated from the State Normal School at Trenton in 1871.

Enright's future wife was in his graduating class. He married Emma Mulford (1844 - 1939) in 1875, and had three children: John Mulford (1876-1934), James Geary (1877-1965), Mildred Lamont (1885-1967) and Emma Mulford (dates unknown). They lived at 37 Court Street in Freehold, N.J.

While Enright is highly regarded for his contributions to New Jersey's public school system, he is particularly known for his influence on Monmouth County schools. He moved to Freehold after college and taught in the one-room Orchard School. After three years of teaching at the Orchard School, students from across the town began to enroll in the small schoolhouse on the strength of Enright's reputation. The overflow was contained in a private house next door, where Enright

became an assistant teacher. By 1874, school trustees saw the need for additional educational institutions. The first graded school in Monmouth County opened in a new building that year, with a capacity of 225 students and five teachers. The Board of Education unanimously chose Enright for the Principal's position. As Principal, he "organized the school, established a course of study, and thus started one of the first graded schools in Monmouth County," (Sinclair, 1993, p. 314). After 10 years, Enright saw the school grow to 600 students and 14 faculty members. He became president of the New Jersey State Teachers' Association in 1891.

He collaborated in his research with another well-known figure in education throughout his career— Dr. Samuel Lockwood, the first County Superintendent of Public Schools. Enright once stated that "Professor Lockwood was my university, and life my experimental laboratory," ("Who's Who in Freehold," 1919).

After Lockwood's death in 1894, Enright was appointed his successor. He continued both positions until 1915, when he was appointed Assistant Commissioner of Education for the State of New Jersey. In 1921, he was promoted to Commissioner of Education, the highest educational position in the state.

During his lifetime as an educator, Enright introduced many modern education concepts that helped the public school system prosper. He was actively involved in public education and general school legislation, promoting free education for all students. He created the first scientific agriculture course in a New Jersey high school. He consistently visited the schools under his jurisdiction to provide counsel and constructive advice. Many of the laws he wrote were quickly adopted by schools throughout the state.

In addition to his tenured positions, Enright was a member of the Monmouth County Examining Board of Teachers, vice-president of the New Jersey Association of High School Principals, and chairman of the State Committee on Teachers' Pensions and the Teachers' Retirement Fund. His civic activities included a position as director of the Central National Bank of Freehold and the Second National Bank of Red Bank. He was also a member of several lodges and educational societies (Red Bank Register, 1926). He also wrote several books and essays, including a Civics textbook and a history of education in Monmouth County (Arlington Memorial Works receipt, 1966).

Enright died in 1926, a few minutes after a speech at a local association chapter. Enright had retired to an adjacent room of the hotel following the talk, collapsing from a heart attack soon after. The "excitement of his speech" induced the collapse, according to local reports from Enright's doctor (Asbury Park Press, 1926). He is buried in Arlington Cemetery, NJ. In 1956, Freehold Regional High School established the John Enright Memorial Library, 51 years after he established the improved Freehold High School.

Emma Mulford Enright (1844-1939)

Emma Mulford Enright (1844-1939) was born in Roadstown, Cumberland County, in 1844. She met John Enright while they were both students at Trenton Normal School. The couple moved

to Freehold shortly after their marriage in 1875. Emma taught in Titusville and in Freehold's Hudson Street grammar school. She also served as her husband's secretary throughout various points of his career.

Emma Mulford Enright died in 1939. She is buried in Arlington Cemetery, NJ.

Emma Mulford Enright Neilson (dates unknown)

Emma Mulford Enright (dates unknown) married Franz "Frank" Neilson in 1916. The wedding took place at the Enrights' 39 Court Street residence. The couple had two children: Ruth Neilson McFadden and John Enright Neilson.

John Mulford Enright

John Mulford Enright (1876-1934), nicknamed "Mulford," grew up in Freehold and moved to Jersey City in adulthood. He graduated from Rutgers College Scientific School in 1895, and from New York Law School in 1897. He practiced business law at the law firm of McDermott, Enright and Carpenter. His letters to sister-in-law Harriet also reference an "Enright Investment Corporation." He was a member of the Bar of the City of New York, the Hudson County Bar Association, the New Jersey Bar Association, and the American Bar Association. He also served as counsel to the Hudson County Memorial Bank.

James Geary Enright (1877-1965)

James Geary Enright (1877-1965), nicknamed "Ennie," was born to John and Emma Mulford Enright in Freehold, NJ. He graduated from the University of Pennsylvania's medical school in 1899. Dr. Enright then moved to Jersey City to intern at Christ Hospital, where he worked as a practicing physician for 50 years.

He married Harriet Estelle Lovett (1878-1935) in 1906 and had two children. One child, Marion Owen Enright, died in 1909 at one year of age. Their other child was Mildred Enright Siver (1912-1988).

Dr. Enright served in both World Wars. He was stationed on navy troop transports during World War I, under the title of Director of Medical Facilities (rank: Senior-grade Lieutenant). In World War II, he served as a heart and lung specialist at Newark Induction Center (Hudson Dispatch, 1949). He was honored by his alma mater in 1962 as a Distinguished Service Alumnus of the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine.

After his retirement in 1965, he moved back to Freehold. He lived with daughter Mildred Siver in the 39 Court Street residence they'd maintained for several years. Dr. Enright's retirement home was next to the Enright family's 37 Court Street residence. He is buried in Arlington Cemetery.

Mildred Lamont Enright (1885-1967)

Mildred Lamont Enright I (1885-1967) was an active volunteer. During World War II, she volunteered for home service and "motor car work" to benefit the Red Cross' Monmouth County chapter. She also established the Enright Memorial Scholarship fund to help students interested in a teaching career.

She served on the executive boards of the Federation of the Jersey Shore Medical Center, the Freehold Auxiliary, and the Freehold Woman's Club. As she was a respected supporter and advocate of the organization, the Monmouth County Historical Association issued a memorial resolution in her honor upon her death. She is buried in Arlington Cemetery.

Mildred Lamont Enright Siver (1912-1988)

Mildred Lamont Enright Siver (1912-1988) was born in Jersey City. She was the second child of James Geary and Harriet Lovett Enright. She was named after her aunt Mildred.

She graduated from the Bergen School for Girls in 1930. She moved to upstate New York to attend Syracuse University. Mildred (II) graduated from the New York State College of Forestry at Syracuse in 1934 with a BS in secretarial science.

During World War II, she was an active volunteer with the Jersey City Red Cross chapter. Siver helped organize other works to answer calls for motor service, even driving ambulances herself when needed (Jersey Journal, 1943, p. 10). She also served on the Junior Services Leagues' publicity committee.

She married Richard W. Siver in 1966. Though she received letters from an admirer named "Herbie" in the early '30s, the collection displays no evidence of a prior marriage.

Like her namesake, Mildred Enright Siver was an active historian. In 1977, she embarked upon an intricate genealogical study of her paternal grandmother's relative, tracing the family link back four generations. She served as president of the Colonial Dames of America and was a member of the Monmouth County Historical Association.

Harriet Estelle Lovett Enright

Prior to marrying James Geary Enright in 1906, Harriet Estelle Lovett (1878-1935) – daughter of J. Wesley Lovett – lived in Chatham, New Jersey. The couple moved to Jersey City after the wedding. They had two children: Marion Owen Enright (1908-1909) and Mildred Lamont Enright Siver (1912-1988). Like her husband, Harriet was actively involved in the medical field. She was a member of the Nurses Club of Hudson County, the New Jersey State Nurses Association and the Jersey City chapter of the Red Cross.

She corresponded with a variety of friends, family, and acquaintances. Her letters provide an observational analysis of her wedding arrangements (including the inability of her father to attend wedding due to "matters at home" and business concerns), the death of her first child, letters from her husband "Ennie" during WWI, and experiences of friends and family members. Harriet was killed in an automobile accident in 1935.

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Scope and Content Notes

The Enright Family Papers consists of correspondence, personal papers, clippings, certificates, financial, military and estate records, essays, cards, scrapbooks, ephemera, photographs and postcards relating to the Enright family of Freehold, New Jersey. It is significant in documenting the personal and professional lives of a prominent family of the towns of Freehold, Monmouth County, and Jersey City, Hudson County, New Jersey during the 19th and 20th centuries. Subjects of interest to researchers are: the history and students of the Freehold Regional Graded School, personal and professional activities and achievements of the Enright family (including John and James Geary Enright), Freehold Graded School, Freehold High School, the history of education in Freehold, the activities of a ship doctor and housewife during World War I, 19th and early 20th century children's paper crafts, the estate of Charles Bowne, and volunteer activities during World Wars I and II. There is a large sample of correspondence to and from Harriet (Lovett) Enright – wife of John Enright's son James Geary Enright– dating mainly between 1906 and 1922. Family patriarch John Enright is represented as well, along with sons James G. and John Mulford Enright, daughters Emma Enright Neilson and Mildred Lamont Enright; and granddaughter Mildred Lamont Enright Siver. The postcards date from 1906, and contain early images of places from around the world, while the vintage greeting cards are excellently preserved examples of this genre.

Size of Collection

The collection is housed in 12 boxes and 2 oversized folders.

Series Description

The Enright Family Papers are divided into seven series: I. Images, II. Personal Papers, III. Legal Documents, IV. Genealogy, V. Miscellaneous, VI. Printed Materials, VII. Postcards and Greeting Cards.

Series I. Images

Approximately 775 photographs are separated alphabetically by subject. For the main players of the collection, photographs of John Enright include a profile negative and images of him with a woman (possible wife Emma Mulford Enright) in late adulthood. The James Enright image is a black-and-white group photograph. The image features about 50 other young men in suits standing behind a row of sitting older men. The photograph appears as if it was taken in front of a large building. Several signatures (including James G. Enright's) are included on the front and back of the image. 1962 color Polaroids of Mildred Enright Siver feature a candid shot and a photograph of her in Colonial Dames attire. The 1963 "Thanksgiving Day" photograph features Mildred Enright, Mildred Enright Siver, and James Geary Enright. Photos of the Enright family gravestones have Mildred L. Enright Siver and one Enright monument with John, Emma Mulford, John Mulford and Mildred (I)'s names inscribed. Images of the Court Street residences are also included.

Series II. Personal Papers

Separated alphabetically by family member, personal papers consists of correspondence, any education degrees or certificates earned throughout the subject's life, memberships, daily transactions, ephemera, memorials, and anything pertaining specifically to the subject.

John Enright's (1852-1926) papers, 1883-1956 consist mainly of professional and memorial files. Secondary sources relating to his activities – e.g. newspaper articles, Freehold Graded School commencement programs, essays, memorial programs, correspondence and speeches – are extensive.

Clippings related to Enright's career and activities with the State Teachers' Association and Freehold Graded School describe his contribution to New Jersey education. A "Who's Who in Freehold" article from 1919 summarizes his origins in Colts Neck, New Jersey in addition to his experiences within the education system. The Association and school-related clippings mention Enright's writings and activities within the institutions.

Enright's legal files reflect his role in the estates of friends and family. John Enright served as the Executor of the estates of his father James Enright and neighbor Charles C. Bowne. Bills of receipt, mortgage records, and other account-related documents relating to the estates are included. Enright's shareholder records from Freehold's Central National Bank are also in this part of the collection.

The program from Enright's State Normal School graduation is also in the collection. Enright is listed in the "A Class" graduates, along with future wife Emma Mulford. Both had above-90 averages.

Certificates and correspondence include information on Enright's personal and professional appointments. An 1894 letter from Nicholas [Bullu] – written on Columbia College letterhead –

congratulates Enright on being elected Superintendent of Monmouth County. A letter from the Society of the Cincinnati in the State of New Jersey asks Enright to give a paper on the Loyalists of Monmouth County for their February, 1898 meeting. Correspondence from Enright to the Asbury Park Board of Education regarding teacher Beatrice E. Preston's candidacy there is also included. While the postcard comes from an "aunt" in Brooklyn and does not list the recipient's name, it features a color drawing of Enright and Freehold High School. The caption reads "Freehold High School, Freehold, N.J. Professor John Enright, County Supt., Principal." Handwritten drafts of articles or speeches are not titled or dated. Some drafts appear to be incomplete. Still, these items – along with commencement programs from Freehold Graded School (during Enright's tenure as principal) and the History and Directory of the Freehold High School (which has a photograph of Enright in the inside cover) – help detail the education environment. Unfortunately, the disposition of his professional files as the Freehold Graded School Principal and County Superintendent of Schools is currently unknown.

The 1956 dedication of the Freehold Regional High School's John Enright Memorial Library is documented in printed programs, typed and handwritten speeches, clippings of the event, a series of news articles on Enright's career and correspondence, including a timeline of major events, between Enright's surviving children Mildred, James Geary and Emma Enright Nielson; and Freehold Transcript editors. While most of the articles come from the Freehold Transcript c. 1956, many clippings are without a source or date. Similarly, besides the "John Enright, Educator" address given by Dr. Charles J. Strahan, many included speeches are without a date, source or author.

Other memorials in the John Enright series come from the 1926 "Education Bulletin," the Monmouth County School Board Association and several obituary clippings.

Emma Mulford Enright's (1844-1939) papers, n.d. include letters and writings relating to her personal activities as well as essays on life and priorities. Correspondence consists of one letter to her brother regarding her upcoming marriage to John Enright.

In Emma Mulford Enright's papers are three handwritten essays: "Song of Class '89," "The Importance of Trifles," and "Life's Shadows." These may have been copied from another source; no other dates or titles are listed. A list of house rules is also included.

Emma Mulford Enright Neilson's papers (dates unknown), 1916-1979 contain her marriage announcement, copied from a "Freehold newspaper article" by Mildred Enright Siver. Articles from the New York Times on her social activities are in the collection as well.

John Mulford Enright's (1876-1934) papers, 1892-1934 include an incomplete letter signed "Your affectionate son, John Mulford Enright." He mentions the Rutgers football season (and a Yale-Harvard rivalry), the status of his laundry and alludes to a dust-up with sister Mildred. His report card from the Rutgers Scientific School further details this era.

John Mulford's obituary comes from the Committee on Legal Biography. His experiences as a corporate lawyer and firm partner are listed, in addition to various bar association memberships.

James Geary Enright's (1877-1965) papers, 1895-1965 focus on his war records and subsequent experiences as a doctor in Jersey City. Bills and letterhead to and from James show his Jersey City office's address at 311 York Street and letterhead. Small envelopes with letterhead show prescription instructions and office hours at a different address (25 Kensington Ave.). Certificates appointing James to the New Jersey Governor's selective service-related Medical Advisory Board and Gorgas Memorial Institute of Tropical and Preventative Medicine's Governing Committee are also included in these professional files.

The bulk of Dr. Enright's correspondence is with his wife Harriet during World War I. These 1917-1919 letters – which Dr. Enright signed “Ennie” and “Daddy” – discuss his experiences as a ship doctor during World War I on the Army's U.S.S. George Washington. Daughter Mildred (II) is referred to as “kiddy.” He writes of the ship's course (the coasts of New York and Europe), experiences with life at sea, healing the wounded, and his leave status. He mentions being accompanied in New York by sister Emma Mulford Enright Nielson, but provides no further details. A letter from another ship's officer addresses Dr. Enright as “Senior Medical Officer” of the “O.S.N.S. George Washington.” The officer asks Dr. Enright to give a man suffering from gout another dose of “lead [opium].”

After a gap of two decades, 1962 letters to University of Pennsylvania and U.S. Army officials describe his Distinguished Senior Alumnus honorarium. A letter from UPenn School of Medicine Dean John McK. Mitchell, M.D. congratulating Dr. Enright on this achievement is included. Enright's letters feature handwritten (possibly draft) letters of thanks to Dr. Albert R. Dreisbach, who presented the award. Clippings from an Army Information Officer are located at the end of the folder.

While the Hudson Dispatch, Asbury Park Press and Freehold Transcript clippings mainly cover Dr. Enright's 1949 retirement, his service in both World Wars, practice details and association memberships are mentioned. Later articles include news photographs and details of the 1962 Pennsylvania Medical School honor. Other personal files include Dr. Enright's War Risk Insurance certificate, 1936 passport (with photograph), a 1906 card announcing his wedding to Harriet Estelle Lovett, and two handwritten essays. “An Old Fashioned Sociable” looks to be an assignment for a Rhetoric class, as signed on the second page.

Military information is represented by Dr. Enright's Officer's Service record (1918) and orders. The service record lists schools attended, previous medical and military service, contact information and current military-related activities. Orders come from memos from the Fourth Naval District. These mostly tell Enright when and where to report for duty and whether his leave or residence requests have been accepted. Dr. Enright was relieved from active duty in May 1919.

Dr. Enright's papers also include memorial records. A bound copy of the memorial resolution passed by the Hudson County National Bank's Board of Directors, of which he was a member, in his honor can be found in this series, along with his Freeman Funeral Home (Freehold, NJ) Memorial Record. A baby book with photographs, birth date and additional information about James and Harriet's other daughter, Marion Owen, is included.

Mildred Lamont Enright's (1885-1967) papers contain recorded memorials to her, namely the Monmouth County Historical Association's memorial resolution and Freeman Funeral Home (Freehold, NJ) memorial record.

Mildred Lamont Enright Siver's (1912-1988) papers, 1920-1979 include correspondence, clippings, certificates, copied essays, and childhood hobby materials. Certificates from the American National Red Cross, the New York Port of Embarkation, and The Salvation Army recognized Siver for her contribution to the war effort. Her American Red Cross membership certificate is included as well, in addition to her Kappa Alpha Theta Sorority membership.

Siver's membership in the New Jersey Society of the Colonial Dames of America is also documented, in right of ancestor John Talcott. She kept detailed genealogical records that may have been used to prove her eligibility. The genealogy file contains pedigree charts and narratives that trace her roots back four generations on both parents' sides.

Childhood toys – paper dolls, stamps, hand-made notebooks, watercolor and pencil drawings – show what games and toys interested the young Mildred Enright Siver (as well as many other children of the era). Stamps are from various countries, including China and Mexico. A lock of Mildred's hair, taken at age 10, was also found within the collection.

Clippings relating to the activities of friends and associates were found inside of Siver's Syracuse commencement program, along with a Red Cross Jersey City Chapter Bulletin. Siver-related clippings provide details on her initiatives as a volunteer war worker during World War II, particularly her activities with the Red Cross chapter.

Correspondence spans the majority of Siver's life. The file contains childhood letters written to her mother during summer vacations with her grandparents, a horoscope, letters written in adulthood, and correspondence regarding Siver's will. Letters written in 1933 by a "Herbie" that address Siver as "My Sweet" suggest that she may have had a romance and/or a husband prior to Richard Siver. She wrote her father about a move to Florida in 1941 with someone (multiple references to "we" and "our" are made), but no specifics are provided.

Siver's obituaries cover her death announcements in The Coast Star and an unidentified Freehold newspaper. Education records include her report card from the Bergen School for Girls (James Geary and Harriet's names are signed on the back) and a tuition bill for separate class lessons.

The program from her 1934 graduation from The New York State College of Forestry at Syracuse University is also in the collection, as are a few copied and typed essays. These may not be original writings.

Harriet Estelle Lovett Enright's (1878-1935) papers, 1904-1922 consist mainly of correspondence between family and friends around Freehold, New York and Jersey City. These letters date from before her marriage to Dr. James Geary Enright (c. 1906) to her

correspondence with her husband and friends during World War I. There is a gap between 1909 and 1917.

Mildred Lamont Enright Siver's (1912-1988) papers, 1920-1979 includes a letter from her father explaining that he may not attend her wedding due to business issues "requiring a large amount of care and anxiety on [his] part" rendering him unable to "throw off [his] cares sufficiently to do justice to the occasion" (April 5, 1906). Many of these letters are addressed to Harriett E. Lovett, care of Prof. A.E. Lovett of Chatham, N.J. Two letters from Dr. Enright, addressed to "My dearest girl," with wedding details are included. Additional letters of this era come from friends congratulating Lovett Enright on the match as well as vendors and family members discussing wedding details.

Letters from 1908 and 1909 extend congratulations and sympathy for the birth and death of Harriet and James' first daughter Marion Owen. The 1909 letters make up the bulk of the correspondence.

Remaining in the series are letters from brother-in-law John Mulford Enright's law firm, in which he provides advice on real estate and other financial transactions. Other letters provide updates on the lives of family members, friends and acquaintances. Topics discussed include general social activities and errands, Nurses Club of Hudson County-related activities, wedding invitations, parties and holidays.

Series III. Documents

Though some members of the family (James G. Enright and his daughter Mildred Enright Siver in particular) were born and/or lived a large portion of their lives in other New Jersey counties – a fact reflected in the collection's non Monmouth County-related documents – most family members eventually returned to the town of Freehold. Many deeds, wills (including John Enright's) and insurance contracts indicate that John Enright's 37 Court Street residence was owned by children John Mulford, James Geary and Mildred Lamont Enright (I) at various times from 1927 onwards. Mildred Enright (I) inherited the property in 1927. James Geary and Mildred (II) resided in the neighboring 39 Court Street residence after his retirement.

This series contains legal documents such as birth, marriage and death certificates, tax bills, utilities, bank notes, shareholding stocks, bills and other financial transaction receipts (such as a bill of sale for an automobile executed by Harriet and James).

Series IV. Genealogy

This series contains the family crest and heritage, pedigree charts, and amateur genealogical research correspondence conducted by both Mildred Enright (I) and (II) among others regarding the Enright/Mulford family and their relations dating back through to the 1600s.

Series V. Miscellaneous

Miscellaneous contains mostly unidentified handwritten poems and essays with no identifying information or obvious Enright-related connection, along with random included items such as a Pullman Car passenger check, prescription blanks from Dr. Enright's practice, and an instruction manual for a Healthmaster stationary bicycle. Scraps of paper upon which are written musings

and limericks have been included. Of particular note is an 1863 letter written by a Civil War soldier to "friend", where the Battle of Champion Hill is mentioned. The series also contains clippings of anecdotes from magazines and newspapers that discuss Monmouth County history. Most notations are not credited.

Series VI. Printed Materials

This series contains books, yearbooks, magazines, autograph albums, journals, pamphlets and late nineteenth/early twentieth century primary school textbooks. Included are Mildred's 1930 yearbook from Mary Lyon school, her American Red Cross First Aid training manual, and one of the Enrights' military field manuals. Dr. Enright's Christmas autograph album from childhood and his copy of *The American Illustrated Medical Dictionary* from 1920 are also included, along with several thick pamphlets containing information on the history of New Jersey.

Series VII. Postcards and Greeting Cards

This series contains over 350 postcards from around country as well as the world, including those from a "Grand European Tour" taken by the Enright women. The earliest postcard dates from 1907. Extensive examples of holiday greeting cards date from the early 1900s onward.

Many of the acidic newspaper clippings were photocopied onto acid-free bond paper, the copies filed with the collection and the original clippings returned to the donor. Photographs were removed from their frames, some of which were transferred to the Museum Collection. Newspaper articles found through the processors' independent research have also been added. Antique documents such as 18th century deeds and wills have been placed in Mylar L-sleeves, while fragile photographs and particularly small items have been placed in Mylar sleeves as well. Many photographs have been preserved in manila envelopes behind a corresponding photocopy.
