I sincerely congratulate you on the signal success of our arms on the fields of Monmouth the 28 Ultimo - Had matters been conducted that morning agreeable to the system for attack, it is more than probable that their whole army would have been routed. Everything was in a fine tern per for a total defeat - their men fatigued, murmuring, and in a state of uncertainty as to their destination - with their leaders much alarmed and discouraged by uncommon desertions - Our inquiry is now on foot, with the cause of the advanced corps recoiling. Gen. Lee who had the command is under arrest.

I am happy to have it in my power to mention the merit of your friend Hamm/. - He was incessant in his endeavors during

the whole day in reconnoitering the enemy, and in rallying and charging. - But whether he or Col. Laurens³ deserves most of our commendation is somewhat doubtful. - both had their horses shot under them, and both exhibited singular proofs of bravery. They seemed to court death under our doubtful cir=
